Minutes

1. For attendance keeping, all participants were requested to fill in a Google Form at the beginning of the meeting.
2. GAPSAs Advisor and members of the 2021 Executive Board made a brief introduction. Participants were thanked for attending the meeting.
3. GAPSAs President, Steven Zhou began the meeting by sharing selected presentation slides from the President's Planning Conference presented in August 2021. The slides are public on the Board of Visitors website. In this presentation, Steven curated selected slides to present to the General Assembly that were specific for graduate students.
 - a. Mason currently receives about \$150 million in external research funding, and the goal is to nearly double that amount in the next few years. This will ideally create more research opportunities and funding for graduate students.
 - b. Some notable challenges include:
 - i. Dr. Washington has noted that institutional funding for doctoral students is not as competitive with similar institutions in the state of Virginia.
 - ii. Enrollment among graduate students is not as high as it could be and has been decreasing in recent years. As the university focuses on increasing graduate student enrollment, there also needs to be additional graduate student support for higher enrollment numbers.
 - c. As part of the six-year academic plan, the university is invested in improving the graduate student experience here at Mason. This includes incorporating the Anti-Racism and Inclusive Excellence task force work into the graduate student experience, increasing research opportunities, and increasing graduate student enrollment and support.
4. Steven then proceeded to introduce GAPSAs.
 - a. GAPSAs aims to engage with graduate students at Mason through intentional engagement and effective advocacy. GAPSAs recognizes that Mason graduate students are a large body of over 10,000 students with diverse needs and perspectives. GAPSAs wants to best represent these needs.
 - b. With over 60 confirmed program representatives for the 2021 Academic Year, the General Assembly will be the main platform to capture the perspectives, challenges, and experiences of the graduate student body.

- c. GAPSA supports Graduate Student Life in creating programming and engagement opportunities for the graduate student body at Mason. GAPSA is open and supportive of collaboration opportunities, and suggestions from all programs to reach the graduate student body.
 - d. GAPSA aims to be an effective advocacy body for the graduate student community at Mason.
 - i. The General Assembly will serve as a platform to vote on issues. Any outcome, insights, and discussions will be relayed to the university administration through GAPSA.
5. Specific Goals for GAPSA 2021
- a. To build the General Assembly as the primary communication between program representatives, and graduate students.
 - b. To develop professional and career development opportunities outside the academic track.
 - c. To tell graduate student experience through the “A Day in The Life of a Graduate Student”.
 - d. To reduce auxiliary costs such as graduation robes.
6. Steven presented on GAPSA highlights since the start of Fall 2021.
- a. Gradstravaganza on August 21 had over 500 graduate student participants.
 - b. There are currently 63 confirmed student representations for the General Assembly for the 2021 academic year.
 - c. GAPSA has tabled at multiple club fairs week since the start of Fall 2021.
 - d. A Graduate Student Fellowships webinar was conducted on 9/15.
 - e. “What I Wish I Knew My First Year: Graduate Student Panel,” a joint collaboration between GAPSA and CHSS, was conducted on 9/23.
 - f. GAPSA had worked with Transportation Services to handle a late night shuttle issue faced by a student.
 - g. Graduate student monthly lunches with the Dean of College of Science to be conducted over the semester.
7. Expectations of General Assembly representatives.
- a. To attend monthly meetings. If unable to, representatives need to send a proxy and to notify Wai Ling Fong (wfong2@gmu.edu) ahead of time.
 - b. To stay in communication. Should GAPSA reach out to ask for knowledge/input, general assembly representatives will be reaching out to their respective departments for input.
